Prince Harry's environmental organ sation is promoting an industry-backs carbon emissions calculator that h previously been accused of "airbrus ing" the true climate inpact of flying

Google in collaboration with some of the worlds biggest travel and tech companies. When asked by The Times is calculate the carbon emissions caused by a typical business class return flight from Los Angeles to Shanghai, its estimate was much lower — at 2600ja, CO2 equivalent. There is still no consensus on how best to calculate accurate carbon emissions on a flight by flight basis, with different organisations usine different methods.

## Mother, 69, on hunger strike back in hospital

The mother of a British-Egyptian prodemocracy activist is in hospital for the second time on the 242nd day of her hunger strike to press for her sons

Lails Souef, 69, the mother of Alas Add El-Fattah was taken to ST-homas' Hospital in central London after she and dangerously low blood sugar levels and blood pressure on Thursday night. Souef, who has not eaten food in September 29 last year, her son's schouled release dale, has declined glucose treatment as part of her hunger strike. Instead, she chose glucagon treatment, which induces the liver to break down fat to preduce glucose. The

Souief was first admitted to hospital a February. In a letter shared by the unily, a consultant at St Thomas said he was at "high risk of sudden death with continued fasting".

Abd El-Fattah, 42, has been detained in Egypt since September 2019. He was sentenced to five years in December 2021 for spreading "false news undermining national security" after sharing a social media post about torture.
